A Proclamation**

**WHEREAS,** across Vermont, clean and readily abundant forms of energy are powering more homes and businesses than ever before; and

**WHEREAS,** Vermont is committed to renewable energy that benefits our economy and environment; and

**WHEREAS,** Vermont’s growing energy economy has created jobs while reducing consumer demand for high-cost, high-carbon “peak energy” by creating and supporting clean, renewable energy sources and increasing energy efficiency; and

**WHEREAS,** clean energy is part of America’s energy future and includes generation from multiple renewable resources; and

**WHEREAS,** the clean energy sector is a growing part of the economy and has been a key driver of economic growth in Vermont in recent years, given the number of jobs in the clean energy sector in Vermont has grown 27 percent since 2013 with about 18,800 people – around 1 in 17 Vermont workers – now holding clean energy jobs, according to the *2018 Vermont Clean Energy Industry Report* by the Public Service Department; and


