Proclamation

Whereas, the energy sector is the leading economic driver in Oklahoma and the state's all of the above approach to energy production plays an important part in America's energy independence; and

Whereas, Oklahoma's energy generation from renewable sources includes wind, solar, hydro, geothermal sources, natural gas, biomass, waste-to-energy, and carbon-capture technologies as well as energy storage; and

Whereas, across Oklahoma, clean and readily abundant forms of energy are powering more homes and businesses than ever before. In 2020, wind supplied 35% of Oklahoma's electricity net generation, ranking us third in the nation in net generation from wind; and

Whereas, almost three times as much energy is produced in Oklahoma as is consumed here. In 2020, Oklahoma was the fourth-largest producer of crude oil and the fourth-largest producer of marketed natural gas among the states; and

Whereas, these jobs that cannot be outsourced due to the on-site nature of construction, installation, and maintenance are inherently local and contribute to the growth of local economies; and

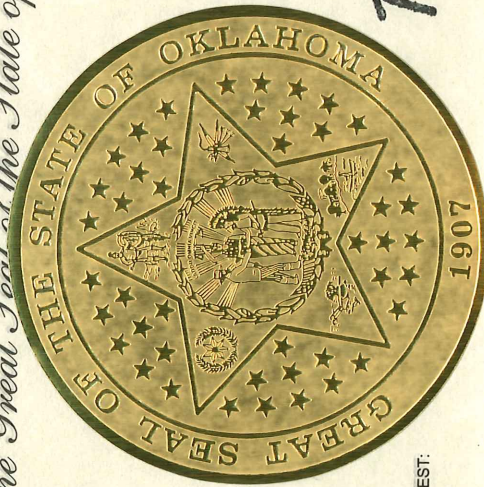
