PROCLAMATION  
BY THE  
GOVERNOR

TO THE PEOPLE OF KANSAS, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas supports an all-inclusive energy portfolio because affordable energy is the backbone of a strong economy; and

WHEREAS, clean energy is part of America's energy future and it includes generation from renewable sources such as hydro, wind, solar, and geothermal, but it also includes natural gas and carbon capture technologies as well as energy storage; and

WHEREAS, as of 2021, Kansas is the third largest wind power producer in the nation, with 45% of the state's electricity generated by wind energy; and

WHEREAS, Kansas is one of the top 10 ethanol-producing states and the state's ethanol plants have a combined capacity of more than 603 million gallons a year; and

WHEREAS, Kansas is home to over 22,000 well-paying clean energy jobs;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Laura Kelly, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF KANSAS, do hereby proclaim September 26-30, 2022 as

National Clean Energy Week

in the state of Kansas and I urge all citizens to join in this observation.
