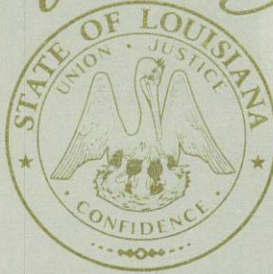

PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS,** 3.5 percent of Louisiana's net electricity generation in 2022 came from renewable sources, with biomass accounting for nearly three-fifths of this renewable power; and
- WHEREAS,** hydropower accounted for nearly three-tenths of Louisiana's renewable power generation; the Sidney A. Murray, Jr. Hydroelectric Station was the world's largest prefabricated power plant at its creation, with a capacity of 192 MW; and
- WHEREAS,** Louisiana's solar power sector is growing, with utility-scale solar power generation in 2022 being five times larger than it was in 2020; and
- WHEREAS,** the clean energy sector provided more than 31,000 jobs in Louisiana in 2022; and
- WHEREAS,** in 2022, Louisiana's two liquefied natural gas (LNG) export terminals shipped out about 63% of U.S. total LNG exports; and
- WHEREAS,** clean energy is a vital and growing part of Louisiana's economy, and Louisiana is proud to join all our partners and stakeholders throughout the State in recognizing and highlighting the importance of clean energy to Louisiana's future.
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, John Bel Edwards, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do hereby proclaim September 25 - 29, 2023 as**

CLEAN ENERGY WEEK
in the State of Louisiana.
