Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, Missouri believes in clean, affordable, and readily abundant forms of energy for all; and

WHEREAS, clean energy is a crucial piece of America's energy future; and

WHEREAS, Missouri had more than 56,000 clean energy jobs; and

WHEREAS, Missouri is projected to add 2,147 megawatts of solar over the next five years, the solar industry employs more than 3,300 citizens, and the solar industry in Missouri includes more than 134 solar companies, 21 manufacturers, 45 installers and developers, and 68 other related companies; and

WHEREAS, Missouri has about 2,100 megawatts of wind power generating capacity and another 299 megawatts under construction; and

WHEREAS, Missouri has the second-largest biodiesel production capacity in the nation at 212 million gallons annually from six biodiesel plants.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, do hereby proclaim September 25 - 29, 2023, to be

CLEAN ENERGY WEEK

in Missouri.
