Proclamation

WHEREAS, the Energy Transition Act, which became law in 2019, established a statewide renewable energy standard of fifty percent by 2030 for New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, as of 2022 there were over 12,600 clean energy jobs; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, wind energy accounted for thirty five percent of New Mexico’s utility-scale electricity net generation, more than five times the amount in 2015; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico is among the top ten natural gas-producing states and has about six percent of the nation’s proved dry natural gas reserves; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, renewable resources accounted for forty two percent of the total in-state electricity generation; and

WHEREAS, New Mexicans cherish their beautiful natural environment and recognize the imminent threat posed by global climate change; and

WHEREAS, municipalities, organizations and individuals should be encouraged to integrate the cleanest lowest-emitting energy resources possible; the public and private sectors should be supported in further investment, research, and development of our state’s clean energy resources.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Michelle Lujan Grisham, Governor of the State of New Mexico, do hereby proclaim September 25 through September 29, 2023 as:

“National Clean Energy Week”

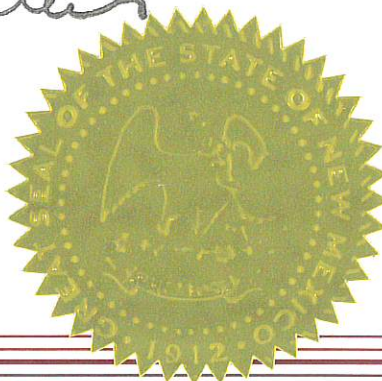
