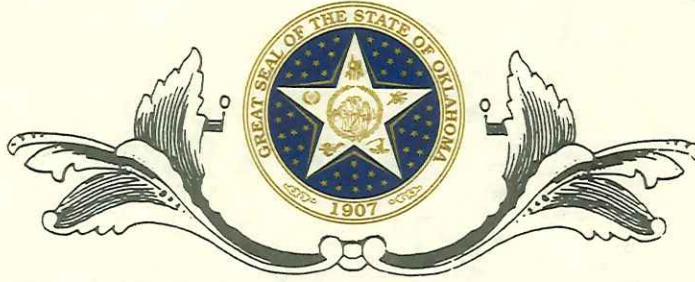


# STATE OF OKLAHOMA
