WHEREAS, the City of Dallas is striving to become more resilient against the effects of climate change; We are looking for innovative ways to help reduce emissions and improve air quality; and

WHEREAS, to ensure a safer and healthier environment for the next generation, the City has implemented the Comprehensive Environmental & Climate Action Plan which has completed 248 milestones towards the advancement of climate initiatives across 8 different sectors in FY 21-22; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of these milestones has helped in the following ways: increase energy efficiency for new and existing buildings, generate more renewable energy, reduce emissions from the transportation sector, limit waste, protect our water resources, maintain the health of our community-owned green spaces, and ensure the air we breathe is clean. Each step is meaningful in the fight to ensure a brighter tomorrow; and

WHEREAS, Texas ranks first in wind-powered electricity generation for the seventeenth year in a row; In early 2023, Texas had over 13,500 megawatts of solar capacity, ranking second in the nation for solar power production; for 2022, Texas ranked first in the nation for overall electricity generation, accounting for more than 12% of the nation's electricity generation and double the amount of the second-place holder; and

WHEREAS, with over 248,000 clean energy jobs, the clean energy sector is a key driver of economic growth in Texas; with great benefits to Texas, these are jobs that cannot be outsourced due to the on-site nature of construction, installation, and maintenance; clean energy jobs are inherently local and contribute to the growth of local economies.
