By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, clean and readily abundant forms of energy are powering more homes and businesses than ever before and are part of America's future; and

WHEREAS, clean energy includes generation from renewable sources such as wind, solar, hydro and geothermal sources. It also includes nuclear, natural gas and carbon capture technologies, as well as energy storage; and

WHEREAS, the clean energy sector has created over 44,000 jobs in Alabama; and

WHEREAS, Alabama is the second-largest hydroelectric power producer east of the Rocky Mountains; and

WHEREAS, Alabama is the fifth-largest generator of electricity from nuclear power; and

WHEREAS, National Clean Energy Week encourages increased organization and individual support of solutions that address America's economic and energy needs and invites municipalities and individuals to implement the cleanest, lowest-emitting energy technologies available;
