PROCLAMATION

OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS: Oregon believes in clean, affordable, and readily abundant forms of energy for all and clean

energy is a crucial piece of America's energy future; and

WHEREAS: Oregon's clean economy—led by more than 58,000 jobs—has created job opportunities in

nearly every metro area, county, and legislative district across the state; and

WHEREAS: Oregon is a partner in the West Coast Electric Highway along with California, Washington,

and British Columbia, Canada. As of February 2024, there were more than 1,200 public electric vehicle charging stations with more than 3,200 charging outlets across Oregon; and

WHEREAS: In 2023, 42% of Oregon's utility-scale electricity net generation came from hydroelectric

power. In total, renewable energy sources accounted for 62% of the state's electricity net

generation; and

WHEREAS: In 2023, wind farms produced 15% of Oregon's electricity net generation, with more than

4,000 megawatts of installed generating capacity. The state is set to have two new wind

power farms in 2025, with a combined 800 megawatts of available power; and

WHEREAS: Oregon's renewable energy portfolio requires that 50% of the electricity sold in the state

comes from renewable energy sources by 2040; and

WHEREAS: Oregon continues to be a leader in clean energy for the benefit of our environmental and

economic future.

in Oregon and encourage all Oregonians to join in this observance.
