WHEREAS, across Vermont, clean and readily abundant forms of energy are powering more

homes and businesses than ever before; and

WHEREAS, Vermont is committed to renewable energy that benefits our economy and

environment; and

WHEREAS. Vermont is a member of the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative that is set to reduce

greenhouse emissions. As a result of this, Vermont has one of the lowest carbon

emissions in the nation; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, Vermont's in-state generating facilities were almost 100% renewable – the

> largest share of in-state renewable generation of any state – and nearly 90% of the electricity delivered to Vermonters was sourced from clean generation that does not

produce greenhouse gas emissions; and

WHEREAS, Vermont's growing energy economy has created jobs while reducing consumer

> demand for high-cost, high-carbon "peak energy" by creating and supporting clean, renewable energy sources and increasing energy efficiency. Clean energy

represented over 18,000 jobs in Vermont in 2022; and

clean energy is part of America's energy future and includes generation from WHEREAS.

multiple renewable resources; and

WHEREAS, the clean energy sector is a growing part of the economy and has been a key driver

of economic growth in Vermont in recent years, given that Vermont has the highest

clean energy employment per capita in the nation at almost 3%; and

WHEREAS. most of these jobs cannot be outsourced due to the on-site nature of construction,

installation, and maintenance, and are inherently local, and contribute to the growth

of local economies.
