- WHEREAS,** 3.5% of Louisiana’s net electricity generation in 2023 came from renewable sources, with biomass accounting for nearly three-fifths of this renewable power; and
- WHEREAS,** I-10 & I-12 national highway performance projects to improve traffic conditions and reduce carbon dioxide emissions; and
- WHEREAS,** Port of Greater Baton Rouge’s Inland Rivers Marine Terminal infrastructure improvements for the Grön project that incorporates carbon capture and sequestration by capturing onsite and is expected to mitigate over one gigaton of carbon dioxide from facilities located at the Port over the production facility’s lifetime; and,
- WHEREAS,** clean power is an important job creator in Louisiana with a clean energy workforce of more than 31,000 jobs in the state in 2023; and
- WHEREAS,** clean energy is a vital and growing part of Louisiana’s economy, and City of Baton Rouge is proud to join all of our partners and stakeholders throughout the State in recognizing and highlighting the importance of clean energy to Louisiana’s future.
