Whereas, Massachusetts is committed to clean and renewable energy that benefits our economy and environment; and

Whereas, Reducing our carbon emissions is essential to the health of our state, residents, and planet, and to protecting property, communities and infrastructure from extreme weather events; and

Whereas, Massachusetts is committed to being a global leader in offshore wind; and

Whereas, Massachusetts has continuously enacted laws and policies to advance clean energy generation and storage, resulting in more than 4 gigawatts of solar energy and more than 13,600 megawatt hours of storage installed or in the pipeline; and

Whereas, Massachusetts has created nation-leading energy efficiency programs, and established clean energy siting and permitting reforms to accelerate the build out of additional clean energy generation; and

Whereas, The clean energy sector provided more than 126,000 jobs in the state in 2024; and

Whereas, Massachusetts continues to invest in clean and renewable energy to support our residents, meet our energy demand, stabilize energy prices, increase energy independence, and protect our environment for future generations,



CLEAN ENERGY WEEK


And urge all the residents of the Commonwealth to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
