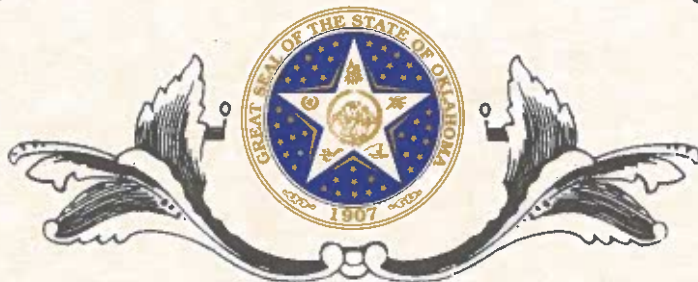

# Proclamation

**Whereas**, the energy sector is the leading economic driver in Oklahoma and the state's all-of-the-above approach to energy production plays an important part in America's energy independence; and

**Whereas**, Oklahoma's energy generation from renewable sources includes wind, solar, hydro, geothermal sources, natural gas, biomass, waste-to-energy and carbon-capture technologies as well as energy storage; and

**Whereas**, Oklahoma's clean energy sector of employment accounted for over 23,657 jobs in 2024; and

**Whereas**, across Oklahoma, clean and readily abundant forms of energy are powering more homes and businesses than ever before: in 2022, wind supplied about 93% of Oklahoma's renewable electricity net generation, surpassing natural gas for the first time, and the state ranked third in the nation in total electricity net generation from wind; and

**Whereas**, almost three times as much energy is produced in Oklahoma as is consumed there. In 2022, Oklahoma was the sixth-largest producer of crude oil and the fifth-largest producer of marketed natural gas among the states; and

**Whereas**, clean energy jobs cannot be outsourced due to the on-site nature of construction, installation and maintenance; are inherently local and contribute to the growth of local economies; and

**Whereas**, we must harness the power of Oklahoma entrepreneurs and small businesses to ensure American energy leadership and dominance in the global marketplace, and continue to provide low-cost, reliable energy here at home;

**Now Therefore**, I, Governor J. Kevin Stitt, do hereby proclaim September 15th - 19th, 2025, as

**"National Clean Energy Week"**

in the State of Oklahoma
