A Proclamation**

WHEREAS, across Vermont, clean and readily abundant forms of energy are powering more homes and businesses than ever before; and

WHEREAS, Vermont is committed to renewable energy that benefits our economy and environment; and

WHEREAS, Vermont is a member of the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative set to reduce greenhouse emissions, and as a result, Vermont has one of the lowest carbon emissions in the nation; and

WHEREAS, in 2023, Vermont generated almost 100% of its electricity from renewable resources—the largest share of in-state renewable generation of any state; and

WHEREAS, about 57% of Vermont’s total electricity generation flows from 47 hydroelectric power plants; and

WHEREAS, Vermont’s growing energy economy has created jobs while reducing consumer demand for high-cost, high-carbon “peak energy” by creating and supporting clean, renewable energy sources and increasing energy efficiency; and


WHEREAS, clean energy is a growing part of the economy and has been a key driver of economic growth in Vermont in recent years; and

WHEREAS, Vermont’s clean energy sector supported 16,251 jobs in 2024, representing the highest employment per capita in the nation in a sector where most jobs cannot be outsourced due to the on-site nature of construction, installation, and maintenance, contributing to the growth of local economies.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim the week of September 15-19, 2025 as


CLEAN ENERGY WEEK
