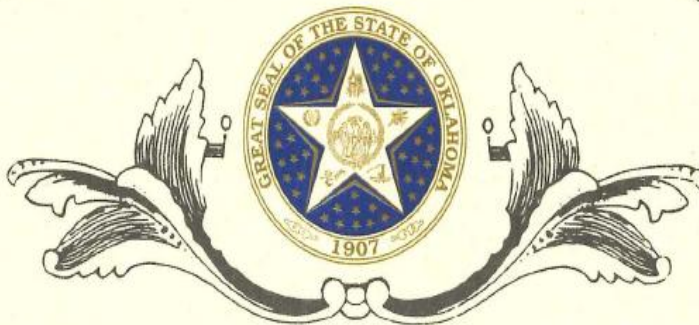

Proclamation

Whereas, the energy sector is the leading economic driver in Oklahoma and the state's all-of-the-above approach to energy production plays an important part in America's energy independence; and

Whereas, Oklahoma's energy generation from a diverse set of sources includes wind, solar, hydro, geothermal sources, natural gas, biomass, waste-to-energy and carbon-capture technologies as well as energy storage; and

Whereas, Oklahoma's clean energy sector of employment accounted for over 25,532 jobs in 2025; and

Whereas, across Oklahoma, clean and readily abundant forms of energy are powering more homes and businesses than ever before: in 2024, wind supplied about 90% of Oklahoma's renewable electricity net generation and the state ranked third in the nation in total electricity net generation from wind; and

Whereas, almost three times as much energy is produced in Oklahoma as is consumed there. In 2024, Oklahoma was the sixth-largest producer of crude oil and the sixth-largest producer of marketed natural gas among the states; and

Whereas, clean energy jobs cannot be outsourced due to the on-site nature of construction, installation and maintenance; are inherently local and contribute to the growth of local economies; and

Whereas, as our country celebrates National Clean Energy Week, I encourage individuals and organizations in Oklahoma's energy sector as it meets America's economic and energy needs in the 21st and century; and

Now Therefore, I, Governor J. Kevin Stitt, do hereby proclaim September 13th - 18th, 2026, as

"National Clean Energy Week"

in the State of Oklahoma
