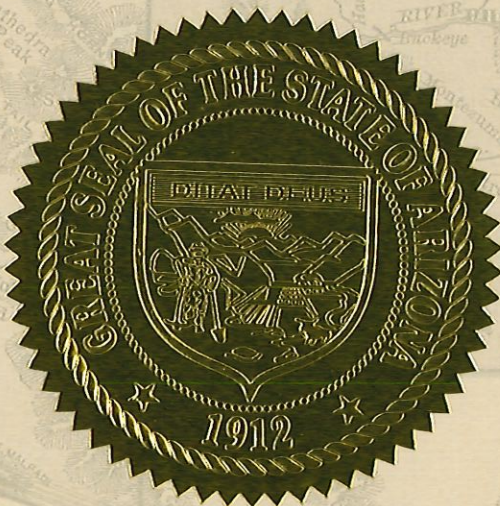

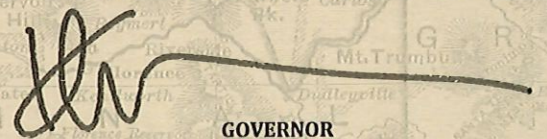
ARIZONA PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, clean and readily abundant forms of energy are powering more homes and businesses than ever before and are a foundational part of America's future; and
WHEREAS, affordable and reliable clean energy is and will continue to fuel Arizona's robust economy; and
WHEREAS, continued advances in clean energy technologies are critical to our energy future; and
WHEREAS, Clean Energy Week encourages increased organizational and individual support of clean energy solutions to power our economy into the future; and
WHEREAS, the clean energy sector has created over 66,000 jobs in Arizona; and
WHEREAS, Arizona consumes more electricity than two-thirds of the states, but its total per capita electricity use is less than in three-fifths of the states; and
WHEREAS, the state's unique clean, firm geothermal resources are used in several direct-use applications, including in an active aquaculture industry that uses geothermal resources to raise shrimp and fish and the use of geothermal heating for copper extraction. Arizona also has many hot springs that attract visitors to several resorts and spas in the state; and
WHEREAS, Arizona ranks among the top five states in the nation in total solar-powered generating capacity from both utility- and small-scale installations, with over 11,000 megawatts installed, generating enough energy to power over 1,600,000 Arizona homes.

CLEAN ENERGY WEEK IN ARIZONA

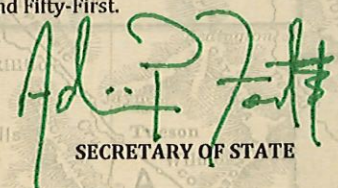
