Proclamation

WHEREAS, the energy transition act, which became law in 2019, established a statewide renewable energy standard of 50 percent by 2030 for New Mexico, and New Mexico is already ahead of schedule, reaching 52 percent renewables as of November 2025; and

WHEREAS, as of 2025 there were over 14,081 clean energy jobs in New Mexico, growing 2.5 times faster than the rest of the state's economy, and New Mexico has attracted \$10 billion in private clean energy investment since 2019; and

WHEREAS, in 2024, wind energy provided the largest share of total in-state generation at 37 percent, almost seven times greater than in 2014; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico is the third largest natural gas-producing state and has about 8 percent of the nation's proved natural gas reserves, while simultaneously cutting methane emissions 70 percent against a 2005 baseline and nearly doubling oil production, demonstrating that environmental protection and energy production are not mutually exclusive; and

WHEREAS, in 2024, renewable resources accounted for 50 percent of the total in-state electricity generation; and

WHEREAS, New Mexicans cherish their beautiful natural environment and recognize the threat posed by climate change; and

WHEREAS, municipalities, organizations and individuals should be encouraged to integrate the cleanest, lowest-emitting energy resources possible; and the public and private sectors should be supported in further investment, research and development of our state's clean energy resources.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Michelle Lujan Grisham, Governor of the State of New Mexico, do hereby proclaim September 14th through 18th, 2026, as:

“National Clean Energy Week”

throughout the state of New Mexico.
