PROCLAMATION
OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

- WHEREAS:** Oregon believes in clean, affordable, and readily abundant forms of energy for all; and
- WHEREAS:** Clean energy is a crucial piece of America's energy future; and
- WHEREAS:** Oregon's clean economy—led by more than 57,860 jobs—has created job opportunities in nearly every metro area, county, and legislative district across the state; and
- WHEREAS:** Oregon is a partner in the West Coast Electric Highway along with California, Washington, and British Columbia, Canada. As of April 2026, there were more than 1,600 public electric vehicle charging stations across Oregon; and
- WHEREAS:** In 2025, 45% of Oregon's total electricity generation came from hydroelectric power. In total, renewable energy sources accounted for two-thirds of in-state electricity net generation; and
- WHEREAS:** In 2025, wind farms produced 14% of Oregon's in-state electricity generation, with almost 4,200 megawatts of installed generating capacity; and
- WHEREAS:** Oregon's renewable energy portfolio requires that at least 50% of the electricity sold in the state comes from renewable energy sources by 2040.
- NOW,
THEREFORE:** I, Tina Kotek, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim September 14-18, 2026 to be

CLEAN ENERGY WEEK

in Oregon and encourage all Oregonians to join in this observance.
